Purple Hands Honor Roll

- Purple Hands Honor Roll, a school-wide activity, recognizes all students who have not used their Hands Or Words For Hurting Others.
- In order to make the honor roll, a student must be able to recite the Purple Hands Pledge™ and must not be caught using their Hands Or Words For Hurting.
- If a student breaks the pledge a note is sent home and the student is taken off the honor roll.
- The students on the honor roll have their names posted on a list outside the principal's office, as well as on a certificate, and will receive a small prize (pin, wristband, magnet to take home)

"In the 2020-21 school year, 95.9% of our students were rewarded!"




Our Partnership began in 2003!

Family Pledge Letter



- Discuss with your family the choices that every member makes when they become angry or upset. Everyone gets angry. Everyone fights.
- Anger is a feeling. Abuse & Violence is Always a Choice.
- Discuss what you will <u>not</u> do with your hands and words when you are angry.
- Promise not to call each other names, put each other down, hit, slap, kick, spit...
- Never touch anyone when you are angry.
- By taking the Purple Hands Pledge and tracing your hand means you are drawing the line to <u>stop and think</u> before hurting yourself or others.
